Virginia Polytechnic Institute & State University ("Virginia Tech") will be prequalifying contractors for the Slusher Tower Bathroom Renovation ("Project") and is requesting Letters of Interest and Statements of Qualifications from interested Offerors for construction services.

The intent of this solicitation is to select qualified contractors ("Contractor(s)") deemed best suited by Virginia Tech to provide construction services for the proposed project. Upon completion of the RFQ process, the pre-qualified Contractors will receive the solicitation.

1. PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

Renovation of existing Slusher Hall bathrooms which each currently consist of 4 water closets, 3 showers, 1 tub and one lavatory. The bathrooms are approximately 257 square feet. The new bathrooms will be approximately 520 square feet with 5 water closets, 5 showers and 2 lavatories with ADA accessible shower and water closet included in the total fixture count. This project will begin on May 18th, 2026. It is critical that the awarded contractor completes this project during the summer academic break. Substantial completion for this Project shall be on August 1, 2026. This Project will renovate bathrooms on floors 12, 11, 10 & 9. This Project will also demolish and enclose the 8th floor bathroom space. The 8th floor will transition the plumbing from the new bathrooms above to the old bathrooms below.

To facilitate the movement of construction personnel, equipment and materials, an exterior elevator will be erected on the north end of the tower against the adjacent stairwell. Access will be through the windows on the North Tower. The windows and the heating piping will be removed on the affected floors and replaced at the end of the project. Power will be made available for the external elevator by taking power from dryers via a disconnect outside the laundry room. A portion of the parking lot between Slusher Tower and Smyth Hall will be utilized as the awarded contractor's "laydown" area during this Project.

Additionally, Student Affairs Facilities & Operations PM Group will be undertaking a new HVAC project to supply future conditioning to the entire tower. Some of this work will also benefit the bathroom ventilation and coordination will be required between the HVAC and the bathroom contractors.

3. SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- A. In order to submit responses to this Request for Qualifications, Offerors wishing to respond to this RFQ must do so by <u>2:00PM EST on Tuesday</u>, <u>December 2</u>, <u>2025</u>. The submission must include any documentation referenced throughout the CO-16 and specified in **Section VIII** of **Appendix** 1.
- B. Qualification statements shall be submitted timely and, in the manner, listed above.
- C. Virginia Tech recognizes the possible existence of confidentiality agreements between an Offeror and previous clients and fully respects such agreements. Any information requested that is considered to be confidential between Offeror and a previous client shall be marked proprietary by Offeror.
- D. Virginia Tech reserves the right to visit the office(s) of an Offeror to verify any claim(s) made by an Offeror regarding staff, facilities, capabilities, qualifications and any other reasonable concerns that may arise on the part of Virginia Tech. In such an event, the Offeror must make every reasonable attempt to clarify any concerns expressed by Virginia Tech.
- E. Virginia Tech will not be responsible for any costs incurred by an Offeror in response to this RFQ.

- F. In the event Offeror discovers an error in its submission, attention may be drawn to the error by providing a written amendment to the initial Qualifications submission. All amendments shall be received by Virginia Tech on or before the date and time fixed for receipt of Qualifications. Offeror shall define who is authorized to approve amendments/changes. If an error is discovered after the time and date of receipt of the RFQ response, Offeror may withdraw from consideration, but the error correction will not be accepted by Virginia Tech.
- G. As noted above, Offerors may contact, in writing, the designated Virginia Tech point of contact for any required clarifications on this RFQ. Offerors are to refrain from contacting other Virginia Tech personnel for purposes of requesting tours or for any other purpose relating to the Project.
- H. Unsanctioned walk-throughs, whether conducted with or without staff accompaniment, are strictly prohibited and may lead to the disqualification of the respective Offeror. Furthermore, any dialogue pertaining to this RFQ is to be exclusively channeled through the Contracting Officer, and should not involve engagement with any other personnel affiliated with Virginia Tech, unless otherwise directed by the Contracting Officer. Failure to comply with these requirements may lead to Offeror's disqualification.

4. EVALUATION OF QUALIFICATIONS:

Offerors' qualifications (as submitted on the attached CO-16) will be evaluated against the criteria specified herein.

5. **QUALIFICATION CRITERIA**

A. BONDING:

- 1) STANDARD BONDING: Contractor can secure bonding for this project in an amount equal to or greater than the estimated construction cost from a surety company (1) listed in the United States Department of Treasury, Federal Register, Circular 570: Companies Holding Certificates of Authority as Acceptable Sureties on Federal Bonds and as Acceptable Reinsuring Companies; and (2) licensed to transact surety business in the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- 2) SELF-BONDING PROGRAM: Contact Virginia Tech for additional details.
- **3) CAPACITY:** The capacity the organization has to meet the project schedule and demands given its current workload.

B. EXPERIENCE AND PERFORMANCE ON PROJECTS OF SIMILAR SIZE AND SCOPE:

This includes consideration of references and client feedback from past and ongoing projects and a demonstrated ability to maintain project schedule and budget.

1) Firm Experience:

a) The Contractor, or the Contractor's office responsible for this project, shall have successfully completed at least three (3) construction projects of similar or comparable scope within the past ten (10) years. These projects must demonstrate the Contractor's capability and familiarity with work of this nature, such as unique access requirements like exterior elevators or access systems, and multi-floor restroom renovations. The projects

- submitted should be sufficiently comparable to allow the Agency to determine the Contractor's ability to manage and execute the scope of work described herein.
- b) The proposed team has worked together on at least one (1) Project in the last five (5) years of similar or comparable scope
- c) Has completed projects of similar scope within a defined critical timeframe.

2) Project Team/Staffing:

- a) The successful organization shall provide and maintain an experienced, professional project team that is tailored to the size, complexity and scope of work of the Project. It is recognized that the composition of the team will vary in response to the particular phases and needs of the Project. However, the Offeror is obligated to provide sufficient staffing with the qualifications required to expertly manage all construction activities relating to the Project at all times.
- b) By submitting a response, the Offeror agrees that no individual assigned to the Project shall be removed from the Project without the prior consent of Virginia Tech.
- c) If the Offeror wishes to reassign an individual from the team assigned to the Project to another Project, the Offeror must make a formal, written request to Virginia Tech and must verify that Virginia Tech has received the request not later than ten (10) working days prior to the intended date of reassignment.
- d) Virginia Tech will make the final, binding decision on a release from the Project of a member of the team not later than five (5) working days from the intended date of reassignment.
- e) The above process may be waived in cases of personal emergency or extreme personal hardship or duress. The burden of proving such conditions to Virginia Tech remains with the Offeror. In cases in which Virginia Tech requests the removal of a member of the team for the remainder of the duration of the Project, the Offeror's Project Manager or Principal-in-Charge will act upon such cases promptly and will, within seventy-two (72) hours, propose a replacement to Virginia Tech.

3) Key Personnel Experience:

- a) The following positions shall require at least three (3) projects in the last ten (10) years of similar or comparable scope, one of those within the past five (5) years:
 - i. Project Manager
 - ii. Superintendent

Equivalent or comparable experience may be considered, at the agency's sole discretion; however, it shall be sufficiently similar so that the agency may conclude that the proposed Project Manager and Superintendent is familiar with and capable of handling the project(s) described herein.

- b) In addition to the positions described above, describe how your firm would staff this project. The Proposal must include a description of the duties and responsibilities of all key Project team members and an organizational chart indicating the title or function of each individual and the reporting structure and functional relationships between the team members.
- c) Has completed projects of similar scope within a defined critical timeframe.

Virginia Tech may also consider other aspects of the qualifications statements as it deems appropriate in evaluating the responses.

6. <u>JUDGMENTS</u>:

Any judgment(s), whether one or several, entered against Contractor for breach of contract for construction within the past ten (10) years may be grounds for denying prequalification, at the agency's sole discretion, after due consideration of the date(s), amount(s), facts and circumstances.

7. SUBSTANTIAL NON-COMPLIANCE:

Any of the following may be grounds for denying prequalification, at Virginia Tech's sole discretion, after review and consideration of the dates, facts and circumstances.

The Contractor:

- A. In the last three (3) years has received a final order for failure to abate or for a willful violation by the US OSHA or by the Virginia Department of Labor and Industry or any other government agency; or
- B. Has **paid liquidated damages** for failure to complete a project by the contracted date on more than two (2) projects in the last five (5) years; or
- C. Has **paid actual damages** resulting from failure to complete a project by the contacted date on more than two (2) projects in the last five (5) years; or
- D. Has been terminated for cause on a contract in the last five (5) years; or
- E. Was more than thirty (30) days late, without good cause, in achieving the contracted substantial completion date where there was no liquidated damage provision on more than two (2) projects in the last three (3) years; or
- F. Has **received more than two (2) cure notices** on a single project in the past two (2) years and/or more than one (1) cure notice on five (5) separate projects in the past five (5) years; or
- G. Has had repeated instances on a project of installation and workmanship deviations which exceed the tolerances in the standards referenced in the contract documents. Documentation of such instances shall be the written reports and records of the owner's representatives on the project; or
- H. Has **finally completed a project** more than 90 days after achieving substantial completion on two (2) or more projects in the last three (3) years, for reasons within Contractor's control. Documented delay of delivery of material necessary to perform remaining work or seasonal

conditions that bear on performing the work or operating specific equipment or building systems shall be considered in mitigation; or

- I. Has had **Performance or Payment Bond claims paid on its behalf** in the last three (3) years.
- J. Has been, or any officer, director, partner, or owner thereof been, in litigation, under investigation, or criminal indictment for wage theft on contracts by any Agency of the Commonwealth of Virginia, any public body or agency of another state, or any agency of the federal government.

8. CONVICTIONS:

Any of the following may be grounds for denying prequalification, at Virginia Tech's sole discretion, after review and consideration of the dates, facts and circumstances.

Contractor or any officer, director, project manager, procurement manager, chief financial officer, partner or owner of the construction company in the past ten (10) years:

- 1) Has been convicted on charges relating to conflicts of interest;
- 2) Has **been convicted** on charges relating to any **criminal activity** relating to contracting, construction, bidding, bid rigging or bribery;
- 3) Has been convicted on charges relating to employment of illegal aliens on construction projects.
- 4) Has been convicted: (i) under Va. Code Section 2.2-4367 et seq. (Ethics in Public Contracting); (ii) under Va. Code Section 18.2-498.1 et seq. (Va. Governmental Frauds Act); (iii) under Va. Code Section 59.1-68.6 et seq. (Conspiracy to Rig Bids); (iv) of a criminal violation of Va. Code Section 40.1-49.4 (enforcement of occupational safety and health standards); or (v) of violating any substantially similar federal law or law of another state.
- 5) Has been fined or adjudicated of having failed to abate a citation for building code violations by a court or a local building code appeals board.

9. DEBARMENT & ENJOINMENT:

The following may be grounds for denying prequalification, at Virginia Tech's sole discretion, after review and consideration of the dates, facts and circumstances:

Contractor or any officer, director, project manager, procurement manager, chief financial officer, partner or owner of the construction company in the past ten (10) years: has been **debarred** or **enjoined** by any agency or political subdivision of the Commonwealth of Virginia, by any agency of the United States or by any agency of another state.

10. SMALL BUSINESS PARTICIPATION:

A. All Project Solicitations:

1) Target Goal: Under Executive Order 35, July 3, 2019 Cabinet Secretaries and all executive branch agencies have been directed to continue and advance the following on a race and

- gender-neutral basis: Exceed a target goal of 50% of all capital outlay spending with small businesses certified by DSBSD.
- 2) At the RFQ stage, Contractors will be evaluated based upon small business participation and compliance on previous projects; see the CO-16 for required information.
- 3) At the subsequent RFP or Bid stage, "short-listed" or pre-qualified Contractors will be required to submit additional small business information as stipulated in the solicitation. This will include a proposed small business participation percentage.
